What do you like most about WNA?

- Newsletters, resources for shovelers, lawn mowers
- Way to stay connected and planned events year round

What would you most like to change about WNA?

- *Quicker response from board* – we have dedicated roles/responsibilities to ensure quicker turnaround with initiatives/communications. In addition, we have greatly improved the check deposit time for membership forms.
- *Fewer emails about the same issues* – we have taken more of a role to moderate what goes through the list serve so our neighbors are not bombarded with many emails around the same topic
- *More casual neighborhood play dates/informal events* – In addition to concerts that were scheduled this year, we are going to have reoccurring “meet ups” to promote play dates/informal gathering times.
- *Make the courier available online* – It is on our website! Perhaps we can have an email announcement?
- *Concerts* – had a few scheduled, more to come this year!
- *Online WNA membership form and payment system* – Done! 60% were completed online.
- *WNA’s vision for the future* – That’s part of the objective of this forum.
- *Neighborhood safety group* – there is a Safety Committee – Chair Mike Bell (michaelbell@wisc.edu)
- *Getting important dates out* – FB, mass email/list serve and courier
- *A way block captains can get engage new neighbors* – currently working on refining our process to get new neighbors members of WNA

Things we can consider going forward:

- Skate donations program for/from Westmorland families?
- Tool, equipment, garden sharing
- Bulletin to come out in a more timely matter
- More block party gatherings/picnics at the park/ice cream gatherings/neighborhood lights during the holidays
- An online version of the directory
- More features in the park, such as a splash pad
- Lights at tennis courts; additional lighting at park; additional walking paths
- Public garbage cans/recyclers around the neighborhood (bus stops, parks and bike paths)
- Add Madison/Dane County current events to the newsletter.
- Organized running/softball/volleyball groups
- More opportunities/events for elders
- Opportunity to meet with our alder?
- Parking at Sequoya Commons – problematic for neighbors to deal with
