Growing Up in a William Kaeser-Designed Home: A Personal Journey-Part II

Living in a home designed by the renowned architect William Kaeser in the Westmorland neighborhood was more than just a childhood experience for siblings Greg and Marybeth Sweeney-Arnold; it was a journey shaped by unique architectural features, family dynamics, and the influence of midcentury modern design. Built in 1960 at 4306 Waite Circle in Madison, the Sweeney family home stands as a testament to Kaeser's innovative vision and the vibrant memories created there.

Architectural Marvels and Family Traditions

Greg and Marybeth vividly recall the distinctive architectural features that defined their Kaeser-designed home. From its grandeur with 5.5 bathrooms, eight bedrooms, and a massive stone fireplace in the living room to its practical amenities like a milk dispenser, indoor incinerator, root cellar, towel warmer, central vacuum, trash chute, and a 1950's nuclear fallout shelter, the house was a blend of functionality and elegance. Each room bore the mark of thoughtful design, from the radiant heated floors in the bathrooms to the outdoor lighting for sports activities.

Marybeth reminisces about the kitchen where every corner was meticulously designed for efficiency; it was a marvel of modern design. Compartmentalized for efficiency, it featured state-of-the-art appliances seamlessly integrated into custom cabinetry. The kitchen also boasted a massive oval table adorned with a lazy Susan—an invitation to communal dining and lively conversation. It was positioned between the kitchen

work areas and the family room, so this area was always buzzing with activity and was the true focal point of the Sweeney household.

The open concept layout facilitated seamless workflow, while the family room served as a central gathering space. Greg fondly remembers the screened porch facing the expansive field behind the house and a secret play space for children where countless memories were made with friends and family.

Yet, amidst its four levels and thoughtful amenities, one feature stood out as particularly ingenious—the laundry chute. As a solution to managing the laundry needs of a bustling household with ten children, it symbolized the home's commitment to streamlining daily tasks and enhancing the quality of life.

In a household with many siblings, the desire for individual rooms was common, prompting a rearrangement whenever someone moved out to allow another to claim their own space. To accommodate this need, their father converted part of the open basement into an additional bedroom.

The house embodied Kaeser's commitment to both form and function. Together, all these elements wove a narrative of a home that not only embraced the future but also set the standard for modern living, leaving an enduring legacy of innovation and inspiration in its wake.

Challenges and Triumphs

Living in a Kaeser-designed home came with challenges. Greg recalls burst floor heating pipes and leaks in the garage that required significant repairs. Despite

these issues, including frequent problems with the radiant heating and an old tar-and-stone roof, the joys of growing up in such a spacious and welcoming environment far outweighed the setbacks.

Impact on Family Dynamics and Community

The design principles embedded in their home influenced not only the Sweeney family's daily life but also their interactions with the surrounding environment. The strategic placement of windows ensured privacy while maximizing natural light, and the expansive garden fostered a deep connection with nature. The house became a hub for family gatherings and community events, reflecting Kaeser's vision of architecture as a catalyst for social cohesion.

The open layout both welcomed and facilitated the effortless flow of people, encouraging movement and interaction throughout the house. With its spacious design and seamless transitions between rooms, the residence became a bustling hub of activity—a place where people gathered—as the family often discovered more than their own children at the dinner table each night. In these moments, laughter echoed, and memories flourished as the Sweeney family and their guests enjoyed gatherings and lively conversations.

With the sound of children's laughter ringing in the air, the Sweeney household was a testament to the bonds of family and the joys of togetherness. Whether it was a holiday feast or a casual get-together, the home radiated with the warmth of shared moments and cherished traditions.

Many times, in the evening the atmosphere transformed, as adults gathered to indulge in spirited conversations. A bar would be set up in the basement, and their mother would lock the doors to keep the children away from the party! From cocktails to laughter, the home echoed with the sounds of merriment.

In the midst of it all, the Sweeney home stood as a beacon of hospitality and warmth—a place where good times were abundant, and memories were made to last a lifetime. And as the night faded into dawn, the echoes of laughter lingered, a testament to the enduring legacy of a home filled with love and laughter.

Legacy and Reflections

As they reflect on their upbringing in a Kaeser-designed home, Greg and Marybeth acknowledge its lasting impact on their perception of architecture and design. The


open spaces and thoughtful details instilled in them an appreciation for the marriage of aesthetics and functionality, echoing the principles of midcentury modernism.

Greg and Marybeth treasure the memories from their childhood home and now both live in homes with open floor plans. Their experiences have given them a deep appreciation for the historical significance and lasting impact of Kaeser's architectural work in Madison. From Hoyt Park to the Swiss chalet-inspired homes, Kaeser's influence continues to shape the architectural landscape of Madison, leaving an indelible mark on its residents.

In conclusion, growing up in a Kaeser-designed home was not just a chapter in the Sweeney family's story; it was a journey enriched by innovation, community, and cherished memories. As they navigate through life, the echoes of Kaeser's architectural legacy continue to resonate, reminding them of the enduring power of design to shape our lives and experiences.

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Nina (Tranchita) Eddy

Long Time Westmorland Resident and Queen of Peace (Class of 1951) Graduate

Nina Tranchita moved to the Westmorland neighborhood with her parents and older sister in 1941 at the age of four. The family settled into the home at 4022 Euclid Avenue and then moved to a new home at 4021 Paunack Avenue in 1950.

Nina attended Our Lady Queen of Peace school as a 7th grader in 1949 and was then a member of the Queen of Peace graduating class of 1951, the second graduating class from Queen of Peace.

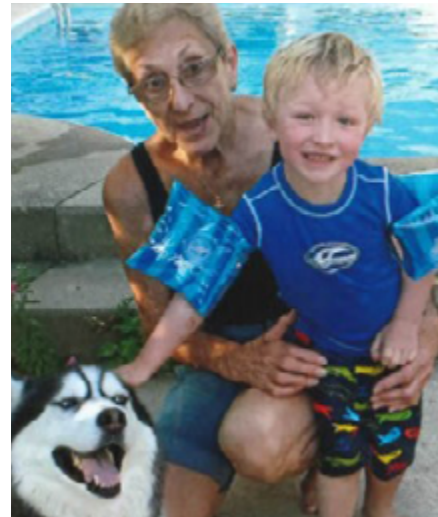
The family moved from Westmorland around 1956, but Nina was going to soon return to the neighborhood. As a young mother, with two young boys, Bill & Chris, she moved into a small cottage style home at 4114 Winnemac Avenue in 1962 where she would live for the next 62 years. Nina worked at many of the most popular Madison super clubs as a waitress and hostess: Lombardino's, Hoffman House, Rhodes Steak House, the

Capital Hill Super Club, and the Avenue Bar. She finished her career as a Madison Metro bus driver.

Nina was often seen walking in the neighborhood with one of her Husky dogs: either Tiki, a Samoyed Husky, and then Java, a Siberian Husky, and visiting with her neighbor. She was also known for inviting her young boy and girl neighbors to stop by to swim in her backyard inground swimming pool.

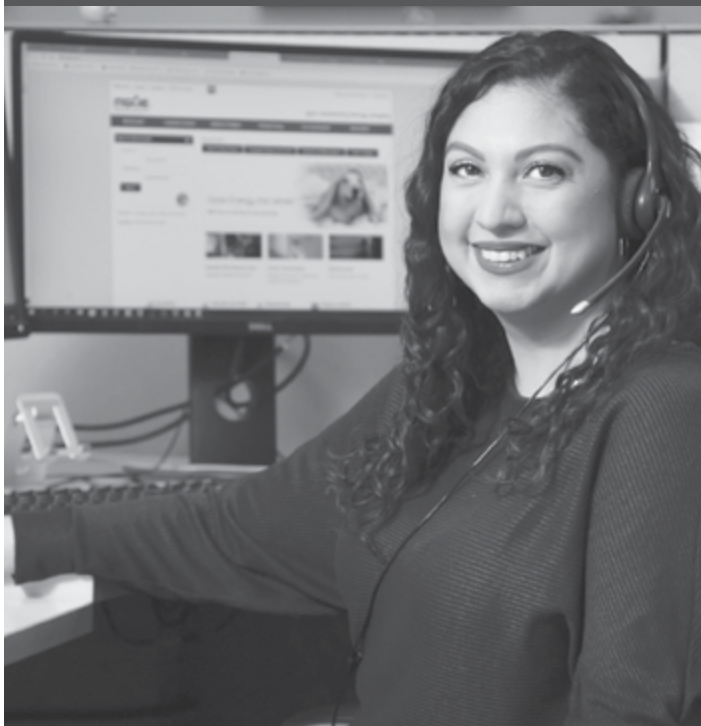

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Making Our Streets Safer, One Step at a Time

If you've traveled on Odana Road east of Midvale Blvd recently, you may have noticed new lines marking a crosswalk at the intersection of Gately Terrace and Parman Terrace. These



lines signal the upcoming installation of sidewalk bump-outs (curb extensions) that will extend the curb into the parking lane, reducing the crossing distance for pedestrians and encouraging slower vehicle speeds. Additionally, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) will be installed to enhance safety for pedestrians and cyclists crossing this busy street.

Funding for the project has already been secured, and City staff are finalizing the engineering plans for inclusion in the citywide contract for 2025. The timeline aims to complete the plans this winter, bid

out the project, and hire a contractor by early 2025, with construction expected to begin in April or May. In the meantime, temporary RRFBs and traffic cones will be put in place. The schematic for the temporary installation, including the sidewalk bump-out configuration, is shown on the next page.

The idea for this crosswalk and RRFB installation originated from a local resident who contacted me after



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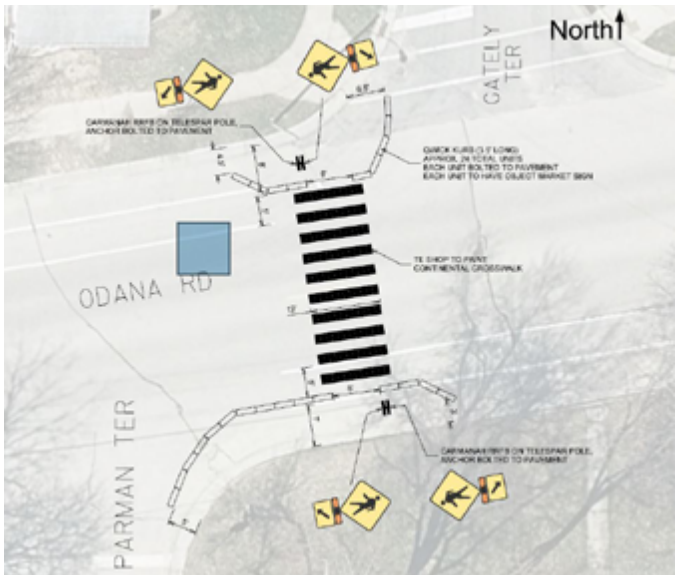
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observing several near-misses between speeding cars and schoolchildren crossing the street. We organized a meeting at a home along Odana Road to discuss the concerns with neighbors whose properties could be affected. The ideas generated during this discussion were then presented to city staff and the transportation commission for approval.

While these projects take time to implement, they will have a lasting impact on the safety and livability of our neighborhood. This initiative is just one of many traffic-calming measures in District 11 since I became Alder, all driven by residents' desire for a safer, more pedestrian-friendly community. By reducing vehicle speeds and improving visibility, these measures will help prevent accidents and save lives.

As our neighborhood grows and traffic patterns evolve, these safety features will play a vital role in fostering a more walkable, connected, and secure environment for everyone.

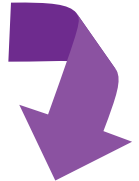
