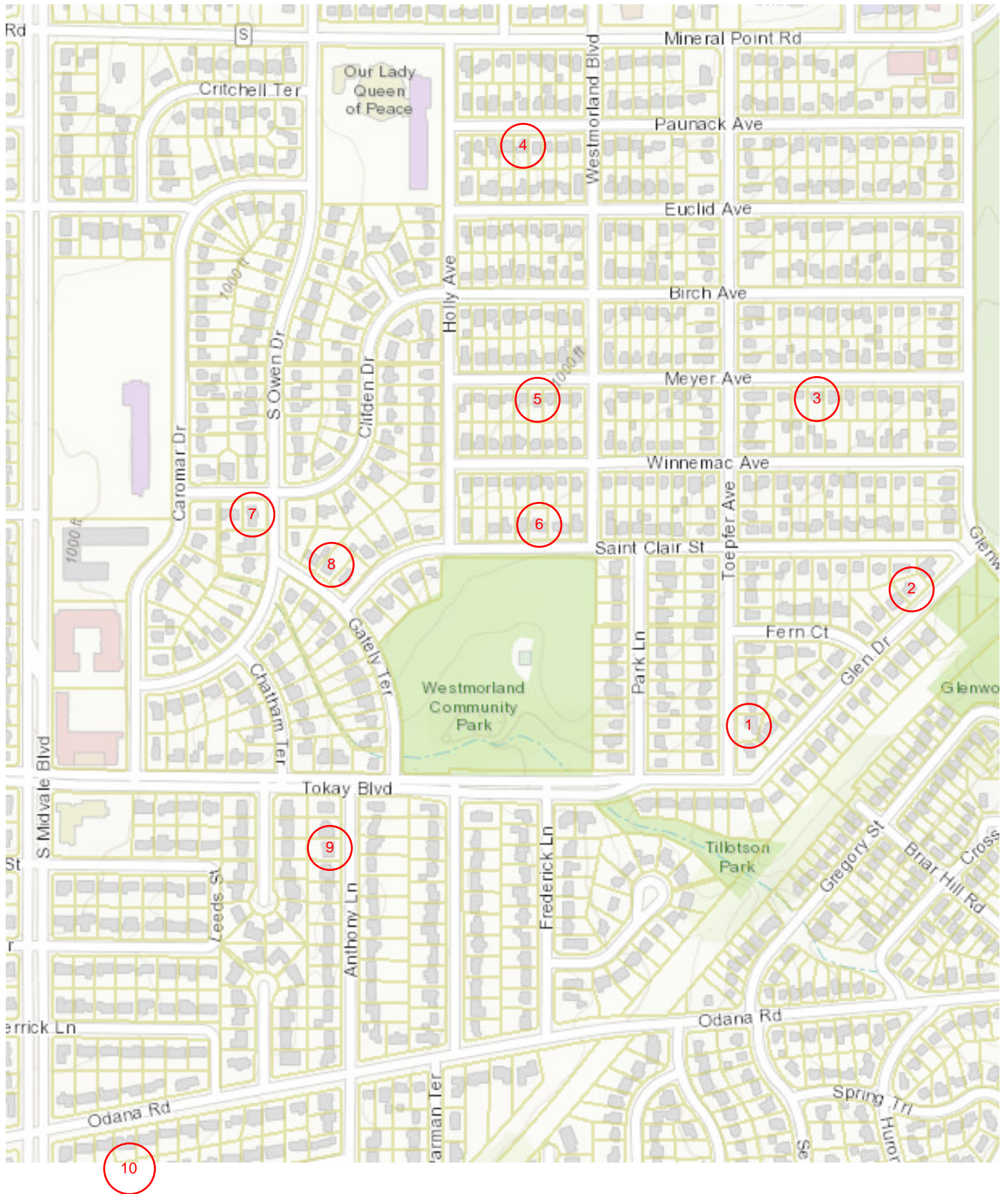


2023 Westmorland Garden Tour Map and Locations List



1. 591 Toepfer Ave.

I try to consider height, leaf structure, color, and bloom time. I test the limits of sun/shade requirements. Basically if it grows, it stays; if it doesn't, it goes. Gardens (front and back) consist of numerous perennials and a lot of annuals. I try to use varying heights, leaves, bloom time and choose plants based on a little color theory. Our garden is a 40 year project."

"Our backyard garden is on two levels. The upper level, next to the house, has a seating area and a small goldfish pond. The lower level has a more formal design, with a rectangle of grass bordered by box hedge and gravel walk. There are gates on the east and west side of the backyard at the end of the stone paths on each side to take you from the front to the back of our home."
